
Public Education Student Forum

From the Pastoral Care Worker

I am a big fan of GPS in cars. Whilst I don't have these, I love the idea of various celebrities lending their voices and characters to GPS. John Cleese as Basil Fawlty for example, when you miss a turn;

"Right, fine! Ignore me! I'm only the navigator." It might say Or Margaret Thatcher's pompous tone when you turn too early; "The Lady's not for turning..." (Look it up!) — or Homer when you get lost; "D'Oh!" I want to put my own voice on so when my wife makes a mistake — "What ya do that for!" "You never listen to me!"

These character voices can make light of errors, mistakes etc. You might however, prefer the reassuring tone the preloaded voices, emotionless and calm.

I was travelling to work recently, winding my way though backstreets to get to the main thoroughfare, when without any notice, streets were blocked and detours abounded, putting me way off course. I thought to myself, "I need the reassuring voice of Siri to guide me." Come and Try Day - Screen and Media




